



## Mini Knitted Knocker



### Materials:

- Regular DK cotton Yarn
- 1 set of 4mm double pointed needles
- Sharp tapestry/darning needle

**Gauge:** 22 sts/24 rows = 4 inches in stockinette stitch

### Abbreviations:

**BO** = Bind off

**CO** = Cast on

**DPN** = Double pointed needle

**K** = Knit

**WS** = Wrong Side

**sts** = stitches

**KFB** = Knit in the front and the back of the same stitch

**K2tog** = Knit two together

**I-Cord** = CO required number of sts onto a DPN. Next row: Do not turn. Switch the DPN back to your left hand and slide all sts to the other end of the DPN. Bring the yarn around the back of the work, start knitting the sts again. After the first 2 sts, give the yarn a sharp tug. Knit remaining sts.

## Mini Knitted Kocker

### FRONT:

CO 3 sts

Work 1 row I-cord, increasing KFB (6 sts). Very small nipple or no nipple is fine but it's good to weave in nipple yarn end before you complete, or the hole will get too small to do it easily.

Next row: KFB each stitch (12 sts)

Start with 4 stitches per needle

Next row: Inc 1 sts at the end of each needle, Repeat until 11 or 12 stitches per needle.

The finished size is 2" across the back but a bit bigger or smaller is ok too.

Knit 1 row with no increases

Next round: Purl 2 sts, BO 4 sts, purl remaining sts. (side hole)

Next round: Knit 2, CO 4 sts, Knit around:

### BACK:

Next row: \*K to last 2 sts on each needle, K2tog\* around,

Repeat until 3 sts remain.

Cut yarn, leaving a 4 – 6 in tail.

Using darning/tapestry needle thread the yarn through the remaining stitches, pull tight and secure.

Because these are just for show, you are free to use other yarns and go crazy with color. We do the stuffing and attaching to key chain.
